We are seeing many positive conversations with students and staff, especially vulnerable students. We are restarting 1:1 mentoring and hope to resume group workshops after half term. A video was made as an alternative to going in to introduce ourselves in assembly to Yr 7. Schools have all commented on how appreciative they are of our presence.

We have several School Pastors who are unable to patrol for health reasons and because of Covid19. Volunteer numbers are down, and we are trying to recruit more, though this is tricky in the current situation. **Please pray** for God's wisdom in this.'
