

'Here we go. Again. But it feels different this time. The days are getting darker, the summer is a memory, and Christmas, New Year, and 2021 are shrouded in uncertainty. How long before this is over?

'How long, Lord?' is not a question that seeks answers found in SAGE reports. It's a question born of an exasperated, broken spirit, crying for comfort more than control. And if you find yourself asking it, you're in good company, as it is commonly asked by the Bible's poets. To be honest with God requires us to be honest with ourselves, to express our *felt* feelings and *thought* thoughts – not just the 'right' ones. Prayers don't have to be neat and tidy. They're best when they're rough and ready, somewhere between frustration and faith, lament and longing, confusion and confidence. Each poet who asks 'how long?' also voices a trust that God will definitively act to make all things well in the end: **'But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation'** (Psalm 13:5). This is a perspective full of faith, hope, trust in God. England's new lockdown will take its toll on our relationships, economy, and collective mental health. It drives me to ask, 'how long, Lord?' but also to put into practice the only sermon application I have ever been able to stick to: when all else fails, pray. It will all be well in the end.'
