'Although the scribes could explain where the Messiah should be born, they remained quite unperturbed in Jerusalem. They did not accompany the Wise Men to seek him. Similarly, we may know the whole of Christianity yet make no movement. The power that moved heaven and earth leaves us completely unmoved.

What a difference! The Wise Men only had a rumour to go by, but it moved them to make that long journey. The scribes were much better informed. They sat and studied the scriptures like so many dons, but it did not make them move. Who had the more truth?

The Wise Men who followed a rumour, or the scribes who remained sitting with all their knowledge? What a vexation it must have been for the Wise Men, that the scribes who gave them the news that they wanted remained quiet in Jerusalem! We are being mocked, they might have thought. For indeed what an atrocious self-contradiction that the scribes should have the knowledge yet remain still. This is as bad as if a person knows all about Christ and his teachings, and his own life expresses the opposite. We are tempted to suppose that such a person wishes to fool us, unless we admit that he is only fooling himself.'

'What are we to make of events in America? Certainly, we should recoil in horror: at a President inciting insurrection; at racism (compare the response to the Black Lives Matter protests); and at blasphemy (banner displaying an American flag and the words 'Jesus is my Saviour' and 'Trump is my President'). We should also remember it's easy for us to pass judgement at a distance—we cannot be complacent about the state of our own nation or humanity in general.

In a democracy, we get the leaders we deserve. If we're concerned about the quality of our politics and political leaders, we should get involved and change them. If we oppose racism, we should redouble efforts to put into practice the theology we profess, that all humans are created equally in the image of God. If we object to Christianity being co-opted by one group, we should not co-opt it into another. We should be rigorous in critiquing, theologically, our own assumptions and commitments, and invite others to do the same.

The kingdom of God is less about getting us into heaven, than getting heaven into us and the world. We must not only express horror at wrong, but address those wrongs and become the change we seek.
