

*'The builders laid the foundation of the temple of the LORD... With praise and thanksgiving they sang to the LORD: 'He is good; his love towards Israel endures for ever.' And all the people gave a great shout of praise to the LORD, because the foundation of the house of the LORD was laid. But many of the older priests and Levites and family heads, who had seen the former temple, wept aloud when they saw the foundation of this temple being laid, while many others shouted for joy'. **EZRA 3:10–12***

It was 539 BC. Persia had taken over from Babylon, and Cyrus, moved by the Lord, allowed captive peoples to go back to their own lands. The books of Ezra and Nehemiah tell of the building projects – the temple and the walls of Jerusalem – that take place after God's people return from exile. No less real, and no less hard graft, is rebuilding the people themselves – in relationship with God and each other. At the heart of the restoration is **worship**. The account is realistic about conflicting emotions, opposition, and delays, but the affirmation of God's character and covenant commitment pave the way for a new start. Hope is rekindled, faith stoked, memories stirred, markers of identity reinstated, promises reaffirmed, God has been praised. For all the differences between their situation and ours, the need for worship is as important today as it was then. Not worship that provides a retreat **from** the world, but worship that shapes us for life **in** the world, paving the way for renewed witness on our frontlines. Like God's people of old, we should not be surprised if joyful happiness is tinged with regretful disappointment. But God is present with us and calls us to see his bigger purpose, to celebrate who he is and what he has done, and to be empowered to be his people in and for the world.
